

NATIONAL SAPS HEAD: “We are ready for 30 June shutdown”

Rape reported almost every four days in Lenasia South policing precinct

Lenasia South police station has recorded a worrying increase in rape cases, with the latest Gauteng crime statistics showing that a rape was reported in the policing area almost every four days between January and March 2026. According to the South African Police Service's fourth-quarter crime statistics for the 2025/2026 financial year, Lenasia South SAPS recorded 24 rape cases during the three-month period. This is up from 19 cases reported during the same period last year, marking an increase of five cases. The figures place Lenasia South at position 19 in Gauteng among the top 40 stations for rape during the quarter under review. The latest numbers mean that, on average, one rape case was reported in Lenasia South police station about every four days during the first three months of 2026. The increase comes as Gauteng recorded an overall decrease in rape cases, dropping from 2,042 cases between January and March 2025 to 1,840 cases during the same period in 2026. Johannesburg District, where Lenasia South falls, also recorded a decline from 772 to 675 rape cases. However, the Lenasia South figures moved in the opposite direction, raising concern for residents, community safety structures and organisations working to protect women and children. Police continue to urge victims of rape and sexual assault to report cases immediately so that investigations can begin and survivors can be linked with medical and counselling support.

The South African Police Service says it is ready to manage the planned demonstrations expected to take place across the country on 30 June, while also protecting the constitutional right to peaceful protest. Acting National Police Commissioner Puleng Dimpone said SAPS, together with metro police, traffic authorities, disaster management teams, private security and other stakeholders, has undertaken planning at national, provincial and

local levels. Dimpone said the aim is to ensure public safety, protect communities and safeguard property, while allowing lawful and peaceful demonstrations to proceed. She also warned that criminal acts such as violence, intimidation, looting, road blockages and damage to property would not be tolerated. Gauteng Premier Panyaza Lesufi said the province, expected to be one of the areas closely watched during the protests, supports the democratic right to peaceful

protest. However, he urged residents to remain calm and allow law enforcement agencies to do their work. The planned demonstrations are linked to concerns around undocumented foreign nationals and illegal immigration. Authorities say immigration matters must be addressed within the law, while the rights and safety of all people in South Africa must be respected. Law enforcement structures say they will continue monitoring developments ahead of 30 June.

Letter to the Editor

The President: Honourable Matamela Cyril Ramaphosa

Sir, Please ensure the safety of all South Africans - including overt threats to the Indian Community. It begs belief that 32 years since that glorious April day in South Africa's history that was met with so much promise of a near utopian society on the horizon, that we sit on the precipice of potential violence or threats thereto. As Commander-in-Chief, your grave responsibility in upholding the Constitution of the republic, is also to ensure the safety and security of the country and her people. By and large, you will concede that crime is rather rampant with little sight of abatement currently. However, the current discourse regarding foreign nationals is enmeshing a disturbing narrative that is assuming violent and threatening proportions. 2021 played out. What was a political matter, became a criminal issue and was then used by opportunists to capitalize on our national default excuse when all else fails - racism. We all know that the despicable acts of 2021 was not about racial in origin - but manifested itself for reasons that suited an agenda. The Indian community are very integral to South Africa. Their contribution in all fields of human endeavour cannot be faulted and must be acknowledged and respected. The Indian community is NOT a mutually exclusive "race" as are any other "race" in South Africa. But any attempts to try and use violence and threats as some bizarre form of attack against them, merely for their presence in their own country, will be met with great and appropriate resistance, if no protection is offered by you as the head honcho of the country. This must be prevented at all costs and you are duly implored to ensure the safety of life, limb and property and not to allow the nefarious forces to ply their evil deeds with agendas beyond that of a civil society and a non-racial democracy. I would hope that this correspondence is met with an appropriate response - after all during vote harvesting season you are often seen traipsing communities across the country pleading for their support, so I am sure a forthcoming response will be equally important to you to allay any fears that might exist. You are duty-bound to do so.

COJ tariff increases take effect from 1 July

Johannesburg residents and property owners should prepare for higher municipal service costs from 1 July following the City of Johannesburg's approved tariff adjustments for the 2026/27 financial year. Property rates will increase by 3.6%, while electricity tariffs will rise by an average of 9.01%. Water and sewer charges will see a combined increase of 12.5%, with higher-consumption households facing steeper costs. The most significant adjustment is the 65.6% increase in the fixed water demand management levy, which rises from R65.08 to R107.74 per month (excluding VAT). Refuse removal services (Pikitung) will increase by 6.2%.

Community members from Region G, together with other civic organisations, held a peaceful Mabahambe March on 18 June. The march began at Lawley Fire Station, where participants gathered from 8am before proceeding to the Ennerdale

Police Station. Here, march and march leaders handed over a memorandum to Ennerdale SAPS, JMPD, Home Affairs and other relevant government departments. "We request that the Department of Home Affairs conduct lawful

verification processes where necessary to ensure compliance with South African immigration laws and regulations," the memorandum. March leaders also requested that the departments acknowledge receipt and provide a written response within

seven days. Ennerdale SAPS acting station commander, Lt Col Romeo Vassen, said: "We have received the memorandum from the community, and we will ensure that it is passed on to our superiors for the necessary attention and response."



No pay, no work: Construction workers close the site in Lenasia South during protest action

Update: Liverpool Pipeline Project workers finally receive part payments after protest action on site

Workers employed by TILBIT Construction confirmed that they received partial payments after staging a protest on 11 June over unpaid salaries. According to the workers, the payment was made two days later, but they claim it was still short. One worker who refused to be named for fear of victimisation, told **GLOBE POST**: "They ended up paying us, but it's short of about 3 days' worth of pay." Earlier on 11 June, workers staged a protest at the company's site, claiming they had not been paid for over a month. TILBIT Construction is based in Liverpool Street, Lenasia South.

The workers accused the company's management of failing to communicate with them about their salaries and the status of the project. Another worker said, that employees had been struggling financially due to the unpaid wages. "We have been working without pay for

over a month now. We get no updates from the CLO, supervisors or management. All I want is my money, they owe us over R11 000 each worker. When we ask them, they dismiss us. My kids are not going to crèche because I owe school fees," the worker said. However, Ward 120 Councillor, Puseletso Nzimande, told **GLOBE POST** that to her knowledge they were paid. "I don't like that this protest is affecting the neighbours' peace. You can't burn tyres in front of other people's houses." She also added that it is the responsibility of the Community Liaison Officer (CLO), Lesidi Molutsi, to update workers on developments related to this matter. This newspaper's repeatedly attempts to reach Molutsi failed. Residents claim the Molutsi has yet to meet with them since the project started.

"I wish to let your readers know that I have officially resigned from the ANC with immediate effect. However, I will continue to serve the residents with regards to service delivery issues as that is my passion," she said.

Here is her statement:

My decision followed what a broken commitment regarding my aspirations to become the next Ward 120 councillor. Ward 120's Cllr Puseletso Nzimande promised me, from the beginning of this year, that I had her support, and that she was definitely nominating me for the Ward councillor position. Trusting her word, I even worked extra hard to get to where I needed to be. This was for the benefit of the community too. I met Cllr Nzimande on 2 June after she called me. She even told residents she had met that morning, that I was to be the candidate. Later that day she told me that she was nominated at SANCO level for the Regional Treasurer position. She then added that it was party policy that she be the 120 candidate this year as Ward 120 councillor. She was quite clear that I was not allowed to contest her as I pose a threat to her candidacy. Looking ahead, my political journey is far from over. I am going back to my home party - blue and white - is where you will find me.

Lenasia South man stabbed while walking home

Ahmed Mohamed's survives knifewounds to his head and back

A 64-year-old Lenasia South man almost lost his life after being mugged by four men while walking home from work around 8pm on 3 June.

According to his wife, Nazeema Mohamed, Ahmed got off a Vereeniging taxi at the Golden Highway and Wimbledon 4-way stop. Ahmed had been using the same route for the past two years. That night, he noticed two men following him, but did not think much of it as he assumed they were also on their way home. At the same time, two other men approached him from the opposite direction. "One of the men walked past him, while the second ran towards him and pulled out a knife. His focused his attention on the man with the knife, not realising that other men behind him were part of the attack. He tried to defend himself, but was subdued and lost consciousness. The attackers dragged him into nearby bushes and left him there, believing he was dead. Unsure how long he was unconscious, Mohamed eventually regained consciousness and managed to find his way home. When he got home, he was blood soaked and collapsed. We immediately rushed him to hospital," Nazeema explained. **Editor's note: Mohamed was treated at the hospital and is recovering well. However, he remains traumatised. We urge pedestrian vigilance as evenings get dark quickly.** GLOBE POST contacted SAPS, but at time of print, we had yet to receive an update.

A FATHER BUILDS A STRONG FAMILY

Future scientists receive fully equipped labs

Grade 11 learners from schools in and around Johannesburg South participated in a physical science quiz tournament hosted by Siyaphambili Projects in Lenasia South on 18 June.

Head of PR and marketing at Siyaphambili Projects, Rochelle Pillay, told **GLOBE POST**: "We had a competition or a quiz tournament for the Grade 11 learners from the schools in and around Johannesburg South."

She said 10 schools were initially expected to take part, but eight participated on the day. The learners were divided into two groups, resulting in two winning schools: Orange Farm Secondary School and Protea Glen High School. As part of the prize "both the winning schools for today, Protea Glen High and Orange Farm Secondary, will get laboratories that are going to be manufactured from the ground up," said Pelay. She said the laboratories would allow learners to do physical science experiments and practical work, giving them greater access to hands-on learning opportunities.

Fred Norman powers the future

An all-girls team from Fred Norman Secondary in Ennerdale emerged as one of the standout groups in City Power's 2026 Energy Efficiency and Demand Side Management Schools Competition, after presenting an innovative project that explores how everyday movement can be turned into electricity.

The competition brought together learners from 12 public non-fee-paying high schools to City Power's head office in Reuven, where they presented energy-saving and renewable energy projects on 12 and 15 June. City Power spokesperson, Isaac Mangena, said the competition showed that young people were not only learning about energy efficiency, but were already thinking seriously about solutions to South Africa's energy challenges: "The future of South Africa's energy solutions lies firmly in the hands of Johannesburg's youth." The Fred Norman team showed how a city's existing movement could become part of the energy solution. Their model demonstrated how the pressure from vehicles compressing piezoelectric disks could generate electric charges and light up LED displays. This idea stood out because it applied clean-energy thinking to everyday urban life. This achievement adds to a growing wave of science excellence coming from Ennerdale schools. Earlier this year, Daleview Secondary learner, Nkateko Moyane, was selected to represent South Africa at the IRIS Global Symposium in

India for his environmental science project, ECOHARVEST, which explores using plants to remove heavy metals from contaminated soil and mining wastewater. Ennerdale Secondary's Naftal Khoza also flew the community's flag high after winning a Silver medal at the Beijing Youth Science Creation Competition in China, proving that learners from Ennerdale are making their mark nationally and internationally in science and innovation.
