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Thanks to conflicting reports, residents are now waiting for clarity on the completion of the long-awaited pipeline upgrade and the restoration of emergency infrastructure completion date.

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Letter to the Editor

Lenasia South was once a sought-after residential suburb to the south of Johannesburg and about 10km further from Lenasia.

For the past 10 years, we residents had to endure daily water shortages due to the influx of many informal settlements surrounding our once beautiful suburb.

We lived with this trauma of not having our human basic amenity, and it was lessened by the announcement in 2020 that a new 15 million litre reservoir would be built to supplement the existing 6 million litre reservoir that supplied our suburb. It was initially catering for 45 000 residents, but with the

informal settlements, this has now spiralled to 120 000 people.

Despite various delays and issues, the new reservoir was finally completed and there was an official opening on 30 June 2022. Amidst all the fanfare and celebrities present, we were promised that our water woes would be a thing of the past and the new reservoir would cater for all residents for the next 40 years.

Alas, from that day we still have almost daily taps running dry, and however hard we try to get explanations from whoever we message or contact, our pleas have fallen on deaf ears. We reside in Ward 120 and have never ever been given an explanation or any feedback as to why we still have these water issues. We initially had no water from 13h00 until 17h30 daily and then again from 21h00 until 04h00. This, however, has changed dramatically in the past six months or so, where we only have water, if we are lucky, from early in the morning until 17h00. Some

days, water is shut off as early as 10:00. The obvious negative impact this has on all residents does not have to be tabulated for you to understand the miserable plight of the residents.

We have a few WhatsApp groups which have many residents on them, and the daily enquiries and complaints are in my possession.

We have nobody assisting us despite our escalations to all we thought might help. We are hoping that by sharing our plight with **GLOBE POST** and Deputy Minister of Water and Sanitation, Jack Bloom, our concerns will finally be heard and the ongoing degradation of our human rights will be addressed.

I speak on behalf of residents of Lenasia South, especially residents of the Liverpool Street block.

Pikitup backlog cleared



Refuse removal is back on schedule in Lenasia South following weeks of disruption

Waste collection services returned to normal after prolonged interruptions left rubbish piling up in several streets and caused frustration among residents.

Pikitup confirmed that the protest action had ended and operations were restored across all 12 depot areas. Randburg, Marlboro and Avalon were among the depots most affected.

The entity deployed additional operational support and weekend collections to clear outstanding waste and bring collection

schedules back on track. "The return to full service is a key step toward stabilising operations," Pikitup said.

Engagements with ad hoc services casuals continued following the protest, while the entity said it would monitor operations and introduce further recovery measures where necessary.

Pikitup also apologised to residents and businesses for the disruption and thanked communities for their patience and cooperation.

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Tanker use questioned!

A video captured on Lancaster Street, Lenasia South, Ext1, has triggered official scrutiny over the allocation of emergency water resources, after a hose was seen running from a municipal supply vehicle into a residential property.

Resident, Preetam Mangar, recorded the scene after noticing the vehicle outside the property. Community members alleged that water was being pumped into a swimming pool at a time when several households are grappling with intermittent supply, burst pipes and aging infrastructure.

Ward 120 committee member for service delivery and infrastructure, Joy Govender, told **GLOBE POST** that requests for tankers had been unsuccessful because only two were reportedly available to assist affected communities. Johannesburg Water spokesperson, Nombuso Shabalala, confirmed to **GLOBE POST** that both the entity and its service provider are looking into the incident. "Thank you for alerting us to this incident. We can confirm that Johannesburg Water's internal auditing department is conducting an investigation into the matter. The matter has also been escalated to the service provider, who confirmed that they will be conducting their own investigations as well," Shabalala said. Deputy Minister of Water and Sanitation, Dr Jack Bloom, said the allegations warranted urgent attention. "I am greatly concerned by this. People are rightly concerned about corruption in the water tanker contracts, now we appear to have outrageous favouritism. This needs to be investigated urgently," Bloom said. **We are awaiting the outcome of Joburg Water's findings in this ongoing story.**

Three bombs used to access Hyperland Ennerdale ATM, cash destroyed bombs attack over ATM

Residents now face fewer banking options after another cash machine was targeted during a break-in, adding

to concerns over access to essential services in the community.

Ennerdale SAPS Station Commander Lieutenant Colonel Romeo Vassen confirmed that police are investigating a case of business breaking, theft and ATM bombing following the incident.

Unknown suspects gained entry to the supermarket before targeting the ATM. No arrests have been made.

Vassen said the latest incident was particularly concerning because Ennerdale already has limited access to banking facilities. "This is the third incident at Hyperland Ennerdale and, at the end of the day, the community suffers when these incidents happen," Vassen told **GLOBE POST**.

An Ennerdale Hyperland spokesperson, said: "I am very impressed with SAPS Ennerdale. Col Romeo Vassen was on scene in the early of that morning accompanied by the relevant stakeholders." A nearby resident, later visited the **GLOBE POST** offices, said the explosion was loud enough to be heard from his home and left him shaken.

According to the South African Banking Risk Information Centre's 2025 Annual Crime Statistics Report, 107 explosive ATM attacks were recorded nationally in 2025, with Gauteng accounting for 31% of the incidents. Police investigations are continuing and the community is urged to contact SAPS with any information.

Cemetery damage fears laid to rest



JCPZ found no signs of intentional damage to the graves

Johannesburg City Parks and Zoo (JCPZ) has moved to allay concerns surrounding the condition of graves at the Avalon Muslim Cemetery, saying evidence gathered does not point to deliberate vandalism or desecration.

The clarification follows concern within the community after several graves appeared to have been disturbed, raising questions about whether the burial sites had been intentionally damaged.

Speaking to **GLOBE POST**, JCPZ spokesperson, Jenny Moodley, said the available evidence suggested a different explanation.

"Thankfully, the evidence does not support this, as it looks like mourners trying to access graves stepped on existing graves," Moodley said. According to JCPZ, the condition of the affected graves therefore appears to have resulted from people moving through the cemetery while attempting to reach other burial sites, rather than intentional acts of damage.

The concerns had drawn attention because of the cultural and religious significance of the cemetery and the importance of preserving the dignity of burial sites. The clarification aims to ease concerns among families and the wider community while offering reassurance over the circumstances surrounding the affected burial sites.

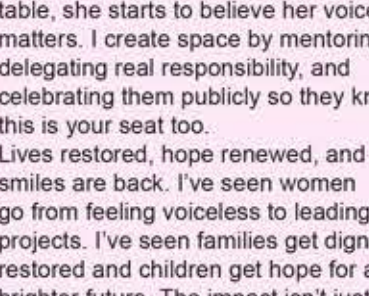
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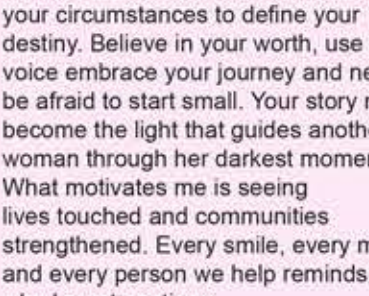
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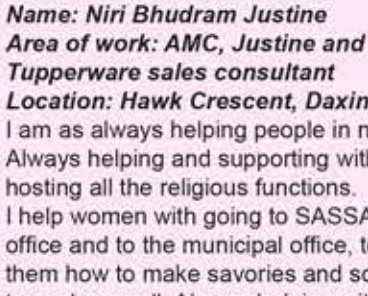
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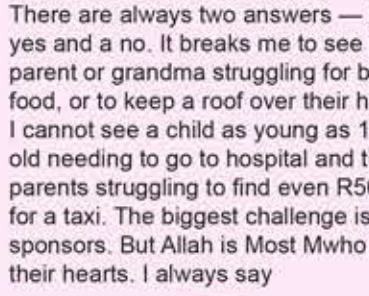
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HER FAITH ON RISK MODE

"Even though, I lost everything, let me risk this one!" thought this woman. A great multitude followed Jesus as He was on His way to Jairus's home to pray for his daughter who was critically ill.
